



## ACADEMIC TRANSPLANT UROLOGIST

The Department of Surgery, Division of Urology, McMaster University, in conjunction with St. Joseph's Healthcare, Hamilton is seeking a full-time academic renal transplant urologist. The Division of Urology provides a comprehensive array of clinical services to the Hamilton Niagara Haldimand Brant Local Health Integration Network which serves a population of 1.35 million people. The urology service also provides tertiary and quaternary level care to patients from other regions of Ontario and plays an essential role in the support of several provincial programs and initiatives. Together with the Department of Surgery at McMaster University, the Division of Urology is involved in educational and research activities at the undergraduate, postgraduate and fellowship levels. This is a full-time faculty position for a period of three years (renewable). Academic rank will commensurate with the candidate's qualifications and experience.

The successful applicant will have completed an accredited fellowship in renal transplantation surgery. The successful candidate is expected to demonstrate commitment to academic research and formal training in research would be an asset. As a full time faculty member, a commitment to surgical education at all levels is essential as is active participation in all academic initiatives of the Division of Urology.

Applicants must have Certification (or be eligible for certification) in Urology from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. However, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be given priority for these positions. McMaster University is strongly committed to employment equity within its community and to recruiting a diverse faculty and staff. The University encourages applications from all qualified candidates including women, persons with disabilities, First Nations, Metis and Inuit persons, members of racialized communities and LGBTQ-identified persons.
