The Division of Urology at the Hospital for Sick Children, consist of 5 surgeons and provides medical and surgical care of the entire urological and genital systems for both boys and girls from infancy to adolescence, specializing in surgical problems of the kidneys, the bladder and the genitalia.

In addition to patient care responsibilities, members of the Division are involved in basic and clinical research with appointments in The SickKids Research Institute. The Division is also recognized for including experts in innovative technologies and international surgery.

The Division maintains an International Fellowship Program with four fellows and is part of the University of Toronto residency program.

The successful candidate is eligible for an academic appointment in the Department of Surgery University of Toronto Faculty of Medicine. The successful candidate must be eligible for academic certification with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and eligible for licensure with the Ontario College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. Salary will be between the range of \$200,000 - \$498,000 for 40 hours work per week, commensurate with qualifications and experience. Benefits include Medical, Dental, Life, Group Insurance, Pension, Vision.
