Director of the McGill University Division of Urology, Department of Surgery and Chief of the Department of Urology, McGill University Health Centre

As Chief of the MUHC Department of Urology, MUHC, the successful applicant will be responsible for the planning, organization, and quality improvement initiatives of adult urological services. In addition to providing leadership in the delivery of excellent clinical services at the MUHC, the successful applicant will manage teaching and research activities and ensure alignment of resources with institutional priorities. As Director of the McGill University Division of Urology, Department of Surgery, in collaboration with the Chair of Surgery, the successful applicant will oversee recruitment and direct the academic activities of McGill's Division of Urology, including optimal distribution of clinical activities across McGill teaching sites and the provincial network led by McGill, as well as educational activities at all levels and hospital-based and on-campus research. The MUHC is a bilingual academic health network and one of the largest and most modern in North America.

The McGill University Division of Urology is composed of 20 full-time urologists dedicated to the achievement of excellence in clinical urologic patient care, research, and education. The divisional members practice at the McGill University Health Centre (adult and pediatric activities), the Jewish General Hospital, and St-Mary's Hospital. The division is at the forefront of urological research in Canada and has achieved international recognition. The research group consists of 7 full-time PhD scientists and 7 surgeon-scientists. The Division's fully accredited residency medical education program provides a 4-year integrated training period to over 18 residents annually and offers several attractive fellowship programs. The successful candidate will be considered for a new fully endowed university Chair in urological sciences.

The successful candidate must be an academic urologist licensed or eligible for licensure in the province of Quebec, whose commitment to research and academic excellence is recognized internationally. He or she should have substantial administrative experience and hold a position of full or associate professor at a university level. Having some knowledge of the Quebec healthcare system, as well as of the French language, although not essential, would be considered an asset.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority. McGill University is committed to diversity and equity in employment. It welcomes applications from indigenous peoples, visible minorities, ethnic minorities, people with disabilities, women, persons of minority sexual orientations and gender identities, and others who may contribute to further diversification.
