UROLOGIST: NS - The Department of Urology at Dalhousie University and the Nova Scotia Health Authority is seeking an academic urologist with subspecialty training in oncology. This position will hold a Continuing Appointment with Annual Academic Career Development at the appropriate academic rank (depending on qualifications and experience) within the Faculty of Medicine. In addition to adult patient care, responsibilities will include teaching, research and administration. The successful candidate will join an established Department of Urology with strong interests in clinical and basic research. Candidates must hold an MD plus FRCSC qualification in Urology, or equivalent qualifications, and must have completed an oncology fellowship. Candidates will have a proven and ongoing research track record. Expertise in the areas of research methodology or translational research would be an asset. Dalhousie University is committed to fostering a collegial culture grounded in diversity and inclusiveness. The University encourages applications from Aboriginal people, persons with a disability, racially visible persons, women, persons of minority sexual orientations and gender identities, and all candidates who would contribute to the diversity of our community.
