he Urological Society of Australia and New Zealand (USANZ) organizes an annual course for residents of all levels enrolled in a training program. Prior to the CUA joining the program, USANZ had a long-standing partnership with Urological Association of Asia and the European Association of Urology. This was truly an international event!
