# Assistant or Associate Professor (Clinical)

## **Position description**

The McGill Department of Surgery in the Faculty of Medicine is seeking applications for a fultime Contract Academic Staff position at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor (Clinical) in the Division of Urology. Professorial rank will be according to the candidate's qualifications and experience. The successful candidate will have demonstrated leadership and excellence in research, teaching, and in the clinical field of urology. This position does not confer eligibility for tenure.

Canada's most international university, McGill is located in vibrant, multicultural Montreal in the francophone province of Quebec. The Department of Surgery is proud of its achievements in the areas of patient-centered surgical care, teaching, research, and evaluation of technology. The Division of Urology is a leader in the delivery of Urologic Oncology care in the province of Quebec. Clinical services are provided primarily through two hospitals on the Island of Montreal: The McGill University Health Centre (MUHC) and the Jewish General Hospital (JGH).

## **Job Duties**

The applicant will be primarily located at the McGill University Health Centre – Royal Victoria Hospital but will also work on occasion at the Jewish General Hospital. The candidate is expected to spend at least 20% of their time involved in research activities and the remaining time will be dedicated to clinical duties such as outpatient clinics and performing surgery. Startup funding including a research stipend may be available to a suitable candidate allowing for protected research time. The candidate shall also to be involved in the teaching of medical students, residents, and fellows, and will be expected to create a program in MRI-based diagnosis and focal therapy of prostate cancer.

## **Qualifications and Education Requirements**

- Must have completed an approved Urology residency.
- Must be certified or eligible to be certified in Urology.
- Must hold an MD and be eligible for licensure in Quebec.

- Must have completed a Fellowship in Urologic Oncology and have demonstrated expertise in image-based diagnosis of prostate cancer and focal therapy of prostate cancer.
- A strong research background is required.
