It is with great sadness that the Canadian Urological Association wishes to inform its members of the passing of Dr. Lorne Aaron on April 30, 2022, after a long and courageous battle against leukemia. Dr. Aaron had just recently stepped down from his role as Chair of the CUA Community Urology Committee.

Dr. Aaron was born and raised in Montreal, where he successfully completed his medical training and urology residency at McGill University.



His practice was on the South Shore of Montreal, at Charles Lemoyne Hospital. He was involved first in the Quebec Urological Association, for which he served as President from 2007–2009. Dr. Aaron then held many positions within the CUA, as member of the Health Policy Committee (2016–2021), member of the Community
