A combination of seminars, mock reviews, and formal peer reviews under the mentorship of experienced CUAJ editors.

Why

The program is designed to:

- **Provide** structured training in the peer-review process, including understanding how to critically evaluate research manuscripts.
- **Enhance** the participants' ability to assess the quality of study design, statistical methods, interpretation of results, and the scientific relevance of urological research.
- **Prepare** trainees for future involvement in academic peer review.

As such, it aligns with the **CanMEDS Scholar** role.

Who

To apply, you must be a urology resident or fellow at a Canadian institution available to attend the **2 online seminars** and complete **3 mentored peer reviews** within the program year.

How

Interested individuals must submit an application that includes:

- Personal information (name, institution, training level, etc.).
- A brief statement of interest (300 words) outlining your motivation for participating in the initiative and what you hope to gain.
- Baseline metrics
