



CUA 2026 in Saskatoon: A landmark meeting for Canadian urology

The 81st Annual Meeting of the Canadian Urological Association (CUA) will take place June 27–29, 2026, bringing Canada's urologic community together for a landmark national gathering. For the first time in its history, the CUA Annual Meeting will be held in Saskatchewan, welcoming delegates to the vibrant city of Saskatoon.

Set against a backdrop of rich cultural meaning and prairie hospitality, CUA 2026 promises an exceptional blend of strong science, thoughtful reflection on health equity, and valuable opportunities for professional connection.

At the heart of the meeting will be a robust and forward-looking scientific program. Delegates can expect an engaging mix of expert-led lectures, interactive panels, and evidence-based discussions highlighting the latest clinical advances, emerging research, and evolving best practices in urology. A defining feature of CUA 2026 is its meaningful commitment to Indigenous health and equitable access to care. This commitment is also reflected in the meeting's visual identity: the official logo, created by Indigenous

artist Chris Chipack, features six Saskatoon berries symbolizing Treaty 6 land. Through this lens, CUA 2026 aligns itself with a broader and essential movement in medicine toward cultural awareness, inclusion, and improved care for historically underserved populations.

Beyond the scientific sessions, CUA 2026 offers a rich social and networking experience. The meeting will commence with a memorable Opening Reception at the Remai Modern, one of Canada's premier art museums and a centerpiece of Saskatoon's cultural scene. Delegates will also enjoy a free Sunday evening, providing the perfect opportunity to explore Saskatoon's riverfront trails, vibrant dining scene, and local attractions. That same evening, attendees can choose to support the CUA Scholarship Foundation at the 2nd Annual CUASF Fundraiser, featuring a highly anticipated performance by Canada's own urology rock band, The Void!

More than a conference, CUA 2026 is a gathering shaped by purpose, connection, and shared vision. Whether you are attending to advance your clinical knowledge, present innovative research, reconnect with colleagues, or build new collaborations, Saskatoon in June 2026 will be the place where Canadian urology looks ahead — grounded in respect, energized by discovery, and united by community.
