### Dr. Owen Albert Audain

Dr. Audain died at the Dr. Georges-L. Dumont Hospital, Moncton, NB, on May 12, 2008, at the age of 77. Born in Basseterre, St. Kitts, Dr. Audain was the son of the late Henry George and Irene Alberta (Liburd) Audain. He received his early education in St. Kitts before sailing to England and Scotland to study medicine. He obtained his medical degree from the University of Edinburgh in 1956. Following internship, he returned to his native St. Kitts to do general practice for 6 years. In 1963, Dr. Audain returned to Edinburgh for postgraduate studies in surgery, receiving his fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons (ED). He then returned to St. Kitts to practise as a surgeon for 2 years. In 1968, he moved to Canada and undertook a residency in urology at Dalhousie University in Halifax, receiving his fellowship in urology from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. He practised in his specialty of urology at the Moncton Hospital and the Dr. Georges-L. Dumont Hospital from 1971 until his retirement at the end of 1999. Dr. Audain was held in high regard by his colleagues in the medical community, staff at both hospitals and by his patients.

During his professional career, Dr. Audain was a member of various medical and professional associations including the Canadian Medical Association, the New Brunswick Medical Society (life membership), the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, the Canadian Urological Association and the American Urological Association Northeastern Section. He held the office of president of the medical staff of the Moncton Hospital and served for many years as head of the department of urology.

Owen is survived by his wife of 16 years, Betty; children, Trevor of St. Kitts, Antony of Toronto and Patti Doiron of Portage Vale; grandson, Andre of St. Kitts; and a large extended family and loving friends.

### Dr. Donald Dow

Dr. Dow died at St. Clare's Mercy Hospital, St. John's, NL, on May 28, 2008, at the age of 76. He died with his wife at his side. Dr. Dow was clinical associate professor of surgery (urology) at the Memorial University of Newfoundland. He was born on the Isle of Bute (Scotland) in 1931. He leaves behind his loving wife, Diane (née Clarke), and devoted children: Donald James (Leslie Smith-Dow), Sara Jane and step-daughter Laura Elizabeth Currie.
